E.C. (Ted) Wallace

The Society lost one of its best-known members when Ted Wallace died after a short illness on July 23rd.

Ted was an exceptionally competent botanist and bryologist, and was well-known throughout Britain, as well as in many other countries. He was a leading light in the B.S.B.I., where he had previously been Recorder for a number of years, and was currently a Vice-President. For many years he was Secretary of the British Bryological Society, and later became President. He was also Chairman of the Surrey Flora Committee.

He led his first botanical meeting at the age of 15 in 1924. This was in Surrey, and for the next 60 years he spent a very large amount of his time in Surrey and Sussex. His knowledge of these counties was unrivalled, and he was responsible for many records of uncommon species. He did many cards for sites.

He will be remembered as a wonderful companion in the field where he was a keen observer right up to his death. For example at this year's A.G.M. he discovered an uncommon moss on the roof of the Staplefield Village Hall.

Above all he was a wonderfully patient guide and teacher. Nothing was too much trouble for him, and he was undoubtedly an inspiration to many budding botanists (and bryologists too) whether young or old.

He served on the committee of the Surrey Flora Society throughout its existence, and was a regular attender at S.B.R.S. meetings, his last one being at Arundel on June 4th.
